Choose 2 or more to complete:

1. Create word banks to describe The Twits by Roald Dahl.
2. Write a letter, as if you were one of the boys who were stuck in the tree, explaining why you have come home without your trousers and what happened to you at the Twits' house.
3. Write and explain in detail, the tricks played by The Twits. Number the tricks in order of nastiness, 1 being the least mean.
4. Imagine that you are a journalist write a newspaper report about what happened to the Twits.
5. The Roly Poly bird is a master at rhyming. Can you write your own rhymes?

Maths

Choose 2 or more to complete:

1. If you have a digital clock, try to write the time in an analogue way, if you have an analogue clock, write the time digitally or on the 24 hour clock. Check the time together at regular intervals.
2. Create 10 three digit numbers and multiply them by a one digit number.
3. Choose four different digits from 1-9 and put one in each box so that the resulting four two-digit numbers add to a total of 100.
4. Write your own real life division word problems and work out the answer. Make them harder and harder to create a challenge.

1. Design a wrapper for a new chocolate bar. Think about the colours, shape, pictures and illustration that you will use in your design.
2. Make a collage of chocolate advertisements on billboards, in magazines and on television.
3. Write a diary entry of Hernan Cortes' visit to the Aztec Empire.
4. Design a brand new chocolate bar. You will need to: Draw and label your design; Make a 3D prototype of your chocolate; Design a poster to advertise your product.
