

Communication & Language

We will continue to use rich language and to encourage your child to develop their skills in speaking and listening. At home you can help by introducing new words into the context of play and activity. When you ask your child a question, use an open question with many possible answers. Show interest in the words that your child uses to communicate and describe their experiences and help them to understand any new words that they come across. You can also help your child to expand on what they say by introducing and reinforcing the use of more complex sentences.

Physical Development

Children will continue to practise writing their names, you can encourage your child to practise writing their name and other letters at home. Keep encouraging your child to dress and undress independently and to make healthy choices when choosing food.

Plan opportunities for your child to tackle a range of levels and surfaces including flat and hilly ground, grass, pebbles, smooth floors and carpets. We will encourage children to develop their gross motor skills and improve their balance and co-ordination.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Our topic this half term is 'Our Community'.

We will learn about different people who help us such as police officers, teachers, doctors, nurses and fire fighters.

We will also be learning about different places in our environment. We will continue to support children by helping them to develop positive relationships with their peers and adults.

You can help at home by speaking to your child about people who help us in the community and how they help us in different ways. Talk to your child about where we can go in the community for different events, for example places of worship, supermarkets for shopping, to the park for playing and exercise etc.

Literacy

We will continue teaching phonics on a daily basis and we will be reading and beginning writing. We will teach how to form letters correctly and introduce reading simple words with the children, for example words such as 'mat', as they progress in their understanding of phonics. At home you can help your child to practise forming letters and read with your child every day. Read stories, poems and fiction books and take time to explain the meanings of different words.



Mathematics

The children will learn to count from 1-20. They will learn to recognise numerals 1-10 and beyond. We will practise placing numbers in the correct order on a number line and begin to learn the value of each number. Children will learn about 2D shapes and their properties.

Encourage your child to count items at home so they can see the value of each numeral. Talk to your child about 2D shapes and their properties. Encourage your child to order numbers 1-20 and spot any numbers they can find in their local environment, for example house numbers or bus numbers.

Expressive Art & Design

We will be using movement to express our feelings. We will think about how we move in different environments, for example, moving through mud and moving through water.
