

The comments parents / carers made

Parent Comment:

Continuously give out wrong term dates in yearly calendar.

Governor response:

The School works in accordance with the term dates set out by Haringey Council which can be found on their website here: http://tinyurl.com/zyoyf3v and on the School website here: http://tinyurl.com/gobhwst. We apologise for any errors and changes over the School year and will make sure that these are communicated to you at the earliest opportunity. In addition, the monthly newsletter includes details and dates of trips, parent evenings, holidays and inset days. A hardcopy of the newsletter is sent out to all parents and is also available on the website. Important dates are also available under the Calendar section of the Website.

Parent Comment:

I like it that the Headteacher usually stands at the front of the School. Also some staff members are really friendly.

Governor response:

The Governors feel it is important for the Headteacher to be available and approachable at the School gates at the beginning of the School day, which allows for any concerns or questions to be raised informally. A member of the Senior Leadership Team, our Attendance Officer and a member of the Site Team are also available on a rota basis.

Parent Comment:

Not enough attention is given to individual's capability. No information is given on how you assess a child's capability.

Governor response:

A planned yearly programme of parent workshops will run next year to inform parents of various curriculum and assessment issues within the School. At every parents evening Parents should be provided with a pupil attainment and progress summary, which explains what level their child is at in relation to Maths and English in comparison to the national averages. To assist Parents, the Teaching and Learning policy has

been updated and is available on the School website. Also with the changes brought in by the new curriculum, children who are more able are challenged further in the classroom and in year 5, more able children can join the Tottenham University Programme. In year 6 there is a specific teacher who now works with more able pupils.

Parent Comment:

Not enough School trips. This year there has only been one School trip (which was to a library).

Governor response:

School trips are an important part of a child's learning and we hope to include more trips into the next School academic year. Training is planned for all staff to ensure they understand the updated trips policy, guidance and procedures. Once this is embedded, staff will feel more empowered to organise more trips. We hope to add a section to the website soon to allow parents to suggest future trips. All classes to start visiting Coombes Croft Library shortly. The School will continue with the very successful Work Week next year which enables every class to go on a trip which is educational and interesting.

Parent Comment:

Working parents should be given more notice for School trips and activities because usually its one week notice and it's hard to organise a day off within a week.

Governor response:

The Governors will feed this back to the School and all dates will be included on the newsletter and on the calendar on the website.

Don't like the passport homework.

Governor response:

The School will continue using this new format at the moment as it is a relatively new initiative and needs time to become established. The idea behind the passport is that the work is project based and more interesting. It is working very well and children are engaged and producing fantastic work.

Parent Comment:

My child really likes this School, has made good progress, it will be better if there was more homework

Governor response:

We are pleased to hear your child enjoys School. We hope homework can be shared with parents and a child can complete every piece of work on the passport if they wish to.

Parent Comment:

The homework passport is difficult as I don't understand it sometimes and I need to find the work for my child to do.

Governor response:

Parents evening is a good opportunity to discuss the passport with your class teacher. The School hope to offer parents more guidance through web links/reference lists of different supporting materials they could use. Support and help is available if this is an area which is difficult.

Parent Comment:

I am happy that my son studies at this School. He really enjoys the School and his after School clubs. Thank you so much to all the teachers.

Governor response:

It is wonderful for Governors to receive such a positive comment and see first-hand how the School makes a difference to children's lives.

We are very happy for sending our child to Devonshire Hill.

Governor response:

Thank you, we are very happy to hear from you.

Parent Comment:

Keep up the good work!

Governor response:

We will do our best, working hard with the staff to maintain and continuously improve every aspect of School life.

Parent Comment:

I'm really happy to send my kids to Devonshire Hill, but I have two concerns. First, is about break time. Kids need more attention when in the playground. Second, is about after School clubs. I wish you would do an English Class as well. Some of the kids have difficulties with English and an extra hour when they can learn will be great.

Governor response:

The School has a number of staff on duty at break times, there is 1 play leader for every class, 2 supervisors and additional staff for reception children. Teaching staff are also available and we have a friendship stop system. A great deal of time and resources are used to assist children who speak English as a second language. If you feel your children may need extra help please raise this concern with the class teacher. English and Maths boosters will be taking place throughout the Summer Term. There is an after School phonics club for Yr. 2, after School Accelerated Reader Club for Yrs. 4-6, English web links available on School website for parents to support their children with sounds and letter formation. All children have home/ School reading books assigned. The School are also planning joint lessons for children and parents, so they can learn and work together.

We need plastic plants or fresh plants within the School, offices and play grounds. This will make the School more welcoming not just to use but also visitors. A shelter is required for the bikes because when it rains the bikes will get rusty and get old quickly. My children like to take their bikes to School but they can't because it rains nearly every day, so they are missing out enjoying their bikes which is also exercise as part of staying healthy.

Governor response:

There are plans to have plants in the main reception area and hanging baskets around the School. There are many competing demands on the School's budget, and improvements are constantly being made to the playgrounds and playing field. We would encourage children to bring their bikes to School, and we are looking at whether the current bike sheds can have a roof put on them. We also hope to resume the gardening club.

Parent Comment:

Is it possible that when the year 3's go swimming they go by bus instead of walking as the weather is getting more cold and we don't want them to catch a cold.

Governor response:

The weather is getting warmer now so we hope the children will be less cold. As we are a Healthy School aspiring for the Gold award, we believe in keeping the trip a walking trip as it is part of their overall PE provision.

Parent Comment:

My children enjoy their School. We are so lucky to be in the School. The School has made such a difference to our child's progress.

Governor response:

We work hard to keep the standards high and help every child achieve their full potential. Thank you for your encouraging feedback.

Happy with School. Feel worried about road outside School, how some parents park. No parents evening for Reception. Would like more homework. Sometimes reading book is not changed for two weeks.

Governor response:

We also have concerns about the road outside the School and parking. The Chair of Governors and the Site Manager have been in discussion with the local authority and will update parents and carers as soon as we hear back from them. With regards to homework, your child, should they wish can complete all parts of the Homework Passport to further their knowledge. We have made the school aware of reading books not being changed regularly and they will that this is carried out going forward.

Parent Comment:

There should be councillors who look after cases.

Governor response:

The new family support worker has started and she is working closely with families who need assistance. The pastoral care team are trained to offer a range of support and I encourage you to contact them if you or your child needs help. We have a strong referral system in place for teachers to refer children and worry boxes have been introduced. The School dog Charlie will also be used in therapy sessions over the coming months.

Parent Comment:

My boy is very happy going to nursery every morning. Teachers are very nice and have taught him to speak. I have a daughter who wants to study in your nursery. Thank you for your support.

Governor response:

We are always grateful to receive feedback about the nursery, the staff at the nursery work hard with the children and we are pleased to hear your child is now speaking.

My only concern is getting information on my child's trip etc. in a reasonable amount of time. The School has definitely improved on this and I hope it continues to get better. I think it would benefit parents to have information on your child's class teacher at the beginning of each new year (academic), whether it be a brief meeting, handout or info pack. This would be helpful. Also what will be happening throughout the academic year e.g. I had no idea in year 2, there will be SATs.

Governor response:

The Governors are working with the Headteacher to improve communication between the School and parents. At the start of year 2 SATs will be discussed at the first parents evening and 'meet the teacher' sessions will take place to share key information. The curriculum overview to be sent out at start of the year and Curriculum overview available on website.

Parent Comment:

Keep up the good work!

Governor response:

Thank you, we will.

Parent Comment:

Homework: could be better. Assembly: more notice needed.

Governor response:

We aim to improve communication between the School and parents. We are in the process of setting up a parent class rep system to help fill in some of the gaps. Key assembly dates to be collated at the start of the year for 16-17 cycle and sent out to parents and uploaded onto website. The homework passport has been referred to several times above.

It would be nice to have notice in advance of events at the School such as School photos, performances etc.

Governor response:

Half termly overviews will be sent out by the admin team in a timely manner. The website will also be updated frequently with important dates under the calendar section of the website and the monthly newsletter will include important dates also.

Parent Comment:

With our child treated and taught well, we have confidence in the School.

Governor response:

It is good to hear you have confidence in the School. As a Governing body we want all parents to have confidence in the School and to support us.

Parent Comment:

School gates should be opened at least 5 minutes before School starts, especially in bad weather so children can start the day feeling warm and comfortable.

Governor response:

School gates open at 8.45am, the School day starts at 8:55am. Children can go into their classrooms at 8.45.
