

## PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT ALLOCATION 2015-2016

The school will receive Pupil Premium totalling £297,500 for 2015-16, based upon Census figures collected in October 2014. This funding relates to 225 eligible children amongst a statutory school age population of 417; in other words 54%. In addition to being allocated for the number of children currently eligible for free school meals, PPG is also provided for any children who have registered as being eligible for FSM within the past six years (Ever 6 FSM).
